#### **Data Definitions & Sources**

#### **DEFINITIONS**

Alcohol-involved Crash – An indication on the UCR that 1) a DWI citation was issued, 2) alcohol was a contributing factor to the crash, or 3) a person in control of a vehicle (including a pedestrian or pedalcyclist) was suspected of being under the influence of alcohol.

Alcohol-involved Driver – A person in control of a vehicle who was cited for DWI or indicated on the Uniform Crash Report as being either suspected or determined by testing to be under the influence of alcohol. There can be multiple alcohol-involved drivers in a single alcohol-involved crash.

**Crash** – A reported incident on a public roadway involving one or more motor vehicles that resulted in death, personal injury, or at least \$500 in property damage. Crashes on private property (such as a parking lot) are not included.

**Driver** – A person in control of a motorized vehicle. Pedestrians and pedalcyclists are not drivers.

**DWI** - Driving While Intoxicated.

DWI Arrest (Citation) - A DWI arrest (a.k.a. a DWI citation) is a driver arrested for a DWI or Aggravated DWI.

**DWI Conviction** – A driver convicted of DWI (driving under the intoxicating influence of alcohol, narcotics, or pathogenic drugs) or an Aggravated DWI. The county listed refers to the location where the driver was arrested for DWI, not their county of residence. Convictions are counted using the year in which the DWI violation occurred, which is not necessarily the year of the conviction.

**Fatal Crash** – A crash in which at least one individual was killed. Note, more than one individual can be killed in a single fatal crash. **Fatalities** – The number of people killed in a crash. The terms killed and deaths are synonymous with fatalities. A fatality is crash-related when it occurs at the time of the crash or the person(s) involved in the crash dies within 30 days.

**Injuries** – The number of people injured in a crash, as opposed to the number of crashes in which people were injured. This includes suspected serious injuries (Class A), suspected minor injuries (Class B) and possible injuries (Class C). Counts include people injured, but not killed.

**Injury Crash** – A reported crash in which at least one individual was injured. Injury crashes involved at least one suspected serious injury (Class A), suspected minor injury (Class B), or possible injury (Class C). Fatal crashes are not included in this category.

Severity of Injury – The degree of injury to a person in a crash as describe by the KABCO scale: K is Killed, ABC indicate injuries (A=suspected serious, B=suspected minor, C=possible), and O indicates no apparent injuries (Property Damage Only).

Suspected Minor Injury – A visible but not serious injury, such as abrasions, bruises and minor lacerations, as observed by the officer at the scene of the crash. Also known as a Class B injury or a "Visible Injury".

**Serious Injury** – An injury, other than a fatal injury, where the person was carried from the scene of the crash or where the injured person was unable to walk, drive or perform normal activities he/she was capable of performing before the injury occurred, as observed by the officer at the scene of the crash. Serious Injuries are Class A and Class B injuries in alcohol-involved crashes.

**Teen Drivers** – A teen driver is defined as a motor-vehicle driver involved in a crash who is between 15 and 19 years old, inclusive **Vehicle** – A motorized car, truck, bus, van, or motorcycle (mechanically or electrically powered) for carrying or transporting persons or things. Pedestrians and pedalcyclists are counted as non-motorized vehicles when in a crash with a motorized vehicle.

#### **DATA SOURCES**

Crash Data – Crash data are from the NMDOT Uniform Crash Reports (UCR), submitted by state law enforcement agencies, for any incident on a public roadway involving one or more motor vehicles that resulted in death, injury, or at least \$500 in property damage. These reports are processed by the NMDOT Traffic Records Program, and analyzed by the University of New Mexico, Geospatial and Population Studies (GPS), Traffic Research Unit (TRU). *Unknown county crash totals are 2 in 2020, 1 in 2021, 2 in 2022, 0 in 2023, and 1 in 2024.* 

**DWI Arrest and Conviction Data** – New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department (NM TRD), Motor Vehicle Division (MVD), DWI File, as of November 2025. Convictions include both DWI and Aggravated DWI. Convictions are counted using the year in which the DWI violation occurred, which is not necessarily the year of the conviction. Totals do not include unknown or missing county information. Unknown county conviction totals are 2 in 2020, 1 in 2021, 2 in 2022, 0 in 2023, and 1 in 2024. Unknown county arrests totals are 77 in 2020. 57 in 2021. 62 in 2022. 86 in 2023, and 1 in 2024.

NM Screening and Tracking System - The NM DWI Screening and Tracking System is based on an automated assessment instrument and informs the database used to monitor DWI offenders after sentencing. All 33 county local DWI programs have used a system to collect alcohol screening information and to track the completion of court-ordered DWI sanctions by DWI offenders within their counties since 1997. Local DWI program staff in each county enters all information into the system. The system contains DWI offender data including name, social security number, birth date, and address. It also contains screening information that is self-reported by offenders during a screening session conducted by the local DWI program staff following (or in some rare cases preceding) conviction. Since July 2020, the screening information is collected via the offender's written responses to the Impaired Driving Assessment (IDA) Survey instrument. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) provided funding to the American Probation and Parole Association (APPA) to develop an instrument that can increase the probability of identifying a DWI offender's risk of engaging in future conduct of impaired driving, and to help determine the most effective community supervision that will reduce such risk. The result of this project was the IDA. The IDA is comprised of two components—a self-report (SR) and an evaluator report (ER). The SR is comprised of 34 questions designed to measure both retrospective and current perceptions of conditions related to mental health and mood adjustment, alcohol and other drug (AOD) involvement and disruption, social and legal non-conformity, and acknowledgment of problem behaviors and motivation to seek help for these problems. The ER component is comprised of 11 questions that provide information around the individual's past DWI and non-DWI involvement in the judicial system, prior education and treatment episodes, past response to DWI education and/or treatment, and current status with respect to community supervision and assignment to education and/or treatment services. The comparison of the ER with the SR provides an estimate of the individual's level of defensiveness and openness to self-disclose, measures that are also important in the estimation of potential risk for recidivism. In addition to this screening information, the database also captures each offender's DWI sanctions from the court's Judgment and Sentencing (J&S) document. These J&S data include the sentencing judge's name, sanction start and completion dates, information about where the offender is sent for the sanction, and how many sessions or days were assigned for each specific sanction.
