

- ✓ **All Local Government ICIPs are due by **Wednesday, July 1st, 2026, at 11:59 pm****
 - Senior Center Facilities
 - Special Districts
 - Nations, Pueblos and Tribes
 - Counties
 - Municipalities
- Projects must be in "Submitted" status and Prioritized by Year and Ranked in CAPS
- *Note: After 07/01/2026 - ICIPs will be locked.*
- ✓ **Resolution from your Governing Body adopting your ICIP for FY 2028-2032**
 - Nations, Pueblos, Tribes may submit a letter from the Governor, President, Chapter President, etc. in lieu of a Resolution

ICIP Extensions

in effect January 2026

- Extension Requests for ICIP project submission **will no longer be allowed.**
- Extensions will **only** be granted for Resolution (or letter for Nations, Pueblos, Tribes) submission until **Friday, July 31st, 2026**, at 11:59 pm.
- Resolution Extension requests and Amendment requests must be done by email to Lgd.icip@dfa.nm.gov

ICIP Amendments

in effect January 2026

- Entities who met the July 1st deadline may amend current projects on their ICIP up until **Sunday, November 1st, 2026****, with approval. New projects will not be allowed.
- May only update the Legislative Language, SOW, and Budget Table.
- New projects will not be allowed.
- Re-prioritization of projects may occur.

ICIP-related Legislation from 2026 Session

- HB 247 - CAPITAL OUTLAY CHANGES
- **Waiting to be acted upon by Governor**
- Includes changes to capital outlay requirements, reauthorizations, and reversions
 - Reauthorization limitations
 - **ICIP requirement for projects \$100,000 & more**
 - Destination fund of reversions
 - Severance tax bond reversions
 - General fund reversions

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; PROVIDING LIMITATIONS AND
REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN CAPITAL OUTLAY PROJECTS,
REAUTHORIZATIONS AND APPROPRIATIONS; AMENDING SECTIONS OF LAWS
2022 THROUGH 2025 TO REQUIRE CERTAIN UNEXPENDED GENERAL FUND
CAPITAL OUTLAY APPROPRIATIONS TO REVERT TO THE CAPITAL
DEVELOPMENT AND RESERVE FUND OR THE TRIBAL INFRASTRUCTURE
PROJECT FUND.

- Check off "These priorities are complete and ready to submit to DFA."





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

OUTDOOR RECREATION TRAILS+ GRANT



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The Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant was created in 2020 to empower communities to enhance outdoor recreation opportunities through funding the planning, development, and improvement of trails and outdoor recreation infrastructure.

- ▶ **\$39+ million awarded**
- ▶ **282 projects funded**
- ▶ **Over 2,600 jobs created**





FY27 OUTDOOR RECREATION TRAILS+ GRANT



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- ▶ \$10 million plus appropriated in FY27 New Mexico State Budget
- ▶ Applications
 - July 1, 2026 – September 30, 2026
- ▶ Submittable grant portal will be used for all reporting and communication





FY27 OUTDOOR RECREATION TRAILS+ GRANT



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ELIGIBILITY

► Tier One

\$25,000-\$99,999

- Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations; Municipalities; Counties; Nonprofits; Public preschools/schools/districts; Public colleges/universities; Soil and water conservation districts; Acequia and land grant associations.
- Project must benefit the local community

► Tier Two

\$100,000-\$499,999

- Same as Tier One + nonprofits with capacity
- Project must provide economic value for the region as a whole
- Collaborative, multi-partner projects are eligible for higher funding levels.

► Tier Three

\$500,000-\$1M

- Same as Tier Two, but nonprofits are not eligible

Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant Funds Distributed: \$28,714,727

The New Mexico Outdoor Recreation Trails+ Grant program empowers communities to enhance outdoor recreation opportunities by funding the planning, development, and improvement of trails and related infrastructure. Designed to boost local economies, strengthen outdoor industries, and foster community well-being, this grant program supports projects that connect people to nature, promote equitable access, and inspire stewardship of New Mexico's landscapes. By investing in outdoor recreation, this grant drives economic growth, enhances quality of life, and ensures lasting benefits for residents and visitors alike.

The Outdoor Recreation Division has awarded 221 Trails+ Grant projects totaling over \$28.7 million to 30 New Mexico counties and 11 Tribal communities since the program's inception in 2020.





FAQs

Are privately owned businesses or state/federal agencies eligible to apply?

No. Neither privately owned businesses nor state/federal agencies are eligible. We encourage partnerships with state/federal agencies and private businesses on these projects, but the application must come from one of the following entities: Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations; Municipalities; Counties; Nonprofits; Public preschools/schools/districts; Public Colleges/Universities; Soil and water conservation districts; Acequia and land grant associations. Note that nonprofits with capacity are now eligible for Tier 2 Regional awards.

Can my organization submit more than one application per grant cycle/fiscal year?

No. Only one submission per entity per NM state fiscal year (July 1-June 30) is allowed. We ask that you do not submit multiple applications from different partners for the same project (in an attempt to increase the odds of it being funded). Please submit one application for the project and include letters of support from your partners.

Do in-kind donations and services qualify as matching funds?

Yes. The match component can be any combination of cash or in-kind (i.e. volunteer hours, prior work, purchase of the land, permitting costs, professional staff services, annual maintenance, donated equipment, services, and/or materials). Other state and federal funds can also be used as a match.

How are awardees selected?

1. An external review committee will individually score applications.
2. The review committee finalizes recommendations through an internal review from the Cabinet Secretary of the NM Economic Development Department.
3. All applicants will receive a notification if they are awarded or declined funding within two months of application deadline.

What is required of a strong application?

Projects will be scored based on five main categories:

1. Recreational value;
2. Contribution to equitable outdoor access;
3. Environmental and cultural impacts;
4. Economic value;
5. Projects with robust, demonstrable community support (in the form of letters of support, resolutions, MOUs, etc.);
6. Projects with multiple partners with well-defined roles.

Tier 2 and Tier 3 Regional applicants will be required to make a formal presentation to the scoring committee during the application process.

What is considered rural?

"Rural" is defined as any part of the state other than Los Alamos County, Albuquerque, Rio Rancho, Farmington, Las Cruces, Roswell, Santa Fe, and a 10-mile radius around those cities.

When will grant announcements be made?

Awards will be announced after each review cycle.

FAQs

Is the match requirement the same for urban and rural applicants?

No. There is a 1:1 match required from all urban applicants. For rural or Indigenous applicants (See previous page for "rural" definition), the match is 2:1. For example, if an urban applicant requests \$50k in grant funds they would need at least \$50k in matching funds; if a rural or tribal applicant requests \$50k in grant funds they would need at least \$25k in matching funds.

When will I be awarded the grant?

Grantees will be awarded 100% of the grant award up front in full after the grant agreement signing, creation of a purchase order, and invoice submitted. Timeframe can vary depending on how quickly required documents are returned.

Can I phase my project?

Yes. The Outdoor Recreation Division encourages phasing. Applicants may apply for Trails+ Grant funds for one phase of a project, then reapply for a second phase once progress and capacity has been demonstrated for phase one. Complimentary applications from multiple stakeholder groups can apply for phased projects.

When can I expect to hear back about my application?

You will receive an email from the ORD team within two months of application close dates, informing you whether your project was awarded funding. Both those awarded and declined funding will be notified.

What are the requirements if I receive a grant?

Projects must be completed within 24 months of the signed contract date. The applicant, adhering to a template created by ORD, must submit one progress report halfway through the grant period and a final report after the completion of the project including financial reporting. The applicant must submit photos and be willing to participate in marketing and promotional efforts, including inclusion of ORD logo in project materials. Applicants will be expected to host an in-person site visit before project completion.

How do I know if I am eligible to apply for a Tier 2 or Tier 3 grant?

Organizations should have an operating budget five times that of the grant request and have dedicated staff to oversee the project. Project must show demonstrable benefit to the whole region, either by attracting and/or retaining residents or attracting visitors.





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


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Pro Tips!

APPLICATION TIPS

- For more information and to access the application, visit the [New Mexico Outdoor Recreation Division website](#).
- Be concise with responses; **there is a word limit for each question**. You will be prevented from submitting if any answer exceeds this limit.
- Double-check the **award amount, budget, and match** to ensure they are accurate.
- Pay **close attention to additional instructions in the application notes**. Some requirements, if not completed correctly, will disqualify you from receiving funding or significantly delay the funding process.
- Confirm the account the application is submitted from is the primary contact. ORD will send all grant updates to the account that submitted the application (for the entire duration of the 24-month grant contract and the application process) **including reporting forms**.
- Save your work in the online application frequently. Connection errors can lead to a loss of data that is not recoverable. **Do not rely on autosave**.
- Take **advantage of the "Collaboration" option** in the online application. This allows organizations to select multiple users to work on a submission. This will appear after you log in to your account, in the top right-hand corner of the application page.
- To avoid technical difficulties, **submit early**. If you do run into technical issues with login, your application, or submission, contact Submittable at the bottom of this [page](#).

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

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

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- New Mexico's vision of a 500+ mile cross-state recreational trail along the Rio Grande
- In 2015, state legislation established the Rio Grande Trail Commission to oversee development
- State of NM contracted for the development of a conceptual Master Plan, completed in 2018.
- Legislators tasked ORD with moving the project forward
- ORD Contracted Pland Collaborative to work with regions to refine the trail alignment
- ORD collaborates with the RGT Commission


